


# Parent View Survey 2019 ~ Results and Actions



## Who Responded?

**47** Families responded:



## Feeling Safe in School

**96%** feel that their child feels safe and is well

looked after

Of those who offered an opinion, **97%**




either strongly agreed or agreed that the NSPCC assemblies and workshops helped their child understand how to keep themselves safe in and out of school .

A very large majority (85%) agreed that pupils are well behaved in school, verses 61% in the January 2018 survey, HOWEVER 49% are unsure of the school's Anti Bullying policies.

School will review how it shares anti bullying policy and procedures with the school community.

## Communication

**90%** agreed or strongly agreed that they feel informed about events taking place in school.



Texts and emails remain the preferred channel of communication

A large majority (70%) feel that The school website helps them feel informed about their child's learning and what is happening in school.

Class teachers to continue to use school website as a channel of communication

## Feeling Informed about Progress

Of those who shared an opinion **90%** agreed that the school responds well to concerns raised, verses 24% of families in January 2018.

The **large majority** of families feel that their child is making good progress at the school and is taught well.

**66%** agree that they receive valuable information from the school about their child's progress.

Parent Forum, lead by Headteacher and Chair of Governors to address how, what and when information on children's progress should shared with families.


## Special Person Day
