

Dear Parent(s)/ Carers

RE: Beyond Equality Workshop

St Dunstan's School is committed to providing a broad and balanced curriculum that supports students to be informed citizens and well rounded young people. Alongside the students normal curriculum, we often offer additional sessions provided by external providers to supplement and support the work that goes on in lessons and tutor time.

Commencing on Monday 16 September, we will be running a series of workshops with Year 9 and 10 boys. These workshops link into our Personal Development curriculum and links to a number of important topics we deliver as part of assembly, tutor and PSHE lessons. The sessions will be run by an organisation called Beyond Equality. This charity works across the UK to promote healthy behaviour and an awareness of gender issues.

The workshops aim to combat the negative stereotypes and attitudes regarding masculinity that can lead to harmful behaviour. It will also tackle issues that directly impact men and boys, as well as others. These include self-esteem, body image, consent, gender-based violence, homophobia, mental health, peer pressure and online issues. These sessions will be run by trained facilitators who are experienced working in a school setting with young people. If you are interested or have any further questions we encourage you to visit www.beyondequality.org, where you can find out more information about the organisation.

The first workshop will involve a 2 hour session Monday 16 September. There will be further workshops taking place over the autumn term. The school will be talking to students about these workshops, the logistics and expectations for the day. Tutor Reading Programme



Read to Succeed in morning tutor time has got off to a great start, with all tutor groups beginning their journey with their new texts.

The texts chosen for our programme range from classics, to award winning Carnegie shortlisted books and feature a range of inspirational characters. Some tutor groups are working with books written by Benjamin Zephaniah, such as Face and Refugee Boy, which look at teen issues such as gang violence and puberty as well as promoting diversity in their characterisation. Others are enjoying the popular dystopia 'The Hunger Games' which features a strong female character as well as some interesting 'what if?' talking points. In addition, non fiction texts are being explored as one group works their way through 'I am Malala' by Malala Yousafzai, a text which will inspire its readers as well as encourage resilience strategies as they explore the trials of her young life so far.

Reading is so important to us all and this time in the mornings is an opportunity to finetune reading skills but its aim is to read for pleasure and so we are enjoying getting lost in the world of fiction twice weekly and we recommend it to everyone!
