through the trip.
















Show Update

This week we are introducing more of our Year 10 Drama students who have taken on extra responsibility to be part of our staging crew...














Introducing the cast of Aladdin...














Next week we will be introducing you to Genie, Jafar and Iago!





Every year one boy and one girl are chosen to take their place in the annual Hunger Games. This happens in Districts One to Twelve, Twelve being where our main character Katniss Everdeen lives. After her sister Primrose Everdeen is elected, Katniss volunteers to take her place with her fellow tribute, Peeta Mellark (the best character in my opinion!) to fight to the death with only one rule in the arena...kill or be killed! Every year one winner is announced, but can a "love story" break the rules?

Why you did or didn't like the book?

I absolutely loved this book! The descriptions in the book are amazing and I felt like I was in the arena at times. The fact that this amazing world of a story came out of someone's head is incredible. The survival in this book is amazing. I could *hear* Katniss' heart beating in the most tense moments.
