Wraparound Care: Next Monday, 30th September, we will be launching our new after school provision in conjunction with Progressive Kids. Progressive Kids is open to all children from Reception to Year 6. Their wraparound care programme at High Littleton Primary School will operates from 3.15pm to 6:00pm. Attendance: As we come to the end of another week, I am delighted that our current whole school attendance is 98%. Over the last few days we have had 100% attendance which is incredible - long may this continue. In terms of punctuality, I am pleased to see very few children arriving late to school, as this is unsettling for the children who arrive after 8.50am.

Packed Lunches: Yesterday, I sent an email regarding some concerns we have with the contents of some of the children's lunch boxes. To reiterate, it is important that children eat a healthy lunch as this improves concentration and behaviour at school and home. Government guidelines recommends that children's lunchboxes contain the following:

- at least one portion of fruit and one portion of vegetables every day e.g. apple or carrot sticks
- one portion of meat, fish or other source of non-dairy protein (e.g. lentils, kidney beans, chickpeas, hummus, and falafel) every day
- oily fish such as tuna or salmon at least once every three weeks
- a starchy food such as whole meal bread/wraps/roll, pasta, rice, couscous, noodles, every day
- dairy food such as milk, cheese, yoghurt or fromage frais everyday

Harvest Service: Next Friday afternoon, we will be visiting Holy Trinity Church for our annual Harvest Service which will be led by Rev. Pitt. The service will begin at 2.30pm. Please note that although this is a whole school service, not all year groups will be participating. This year the service will include items by children in Otter and Robin classes.

Bath Spa Student: This week we have welcomed Miss Bethany Blades to our school as she embarks on the potential career as a teacher. Miss Blades will be working in Fox Class, alongside Miss Langley.

If you receive any of the benefits listed below, and your child attends a Bath and North East Somerset academy or maintained school, please register for benefit related free school meals.

Registration could attract Pupil Premium funding for your child's school, £1480 per Primary pupil and £1050 per Secondary pupil.

- Universal Credit (provided you have an annual net earned income of no more than £7,400, as assessed by earnings from up to three of your most recent assessment periods)
- Income Support
- Income-Based Jobseekers Allowance
- Income Related Employment Support Allowance
- Child Tax Credit (WITHOUT Working Tax Credit) and have and annual household income (as assessed by HMRC) below £16,190
- Working Tax Credit Run-on which is only paid for 4 weeks after you STOP qualifying for Working Tax Credit
- The Guaranteed Element of State Pension Credit
- Support under PartV1 of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
