Further to earlier correspondence this week, we are pleased to announce that St Dunstan's School has reached the target of 50,000 On Track Points. This is a fantastic achievement and demonstrates that students are consistently meeting or going above and beyond our expectations on a daily basis.

In recognition of this hard work, we are pleased to announce that there will be a non school uniform day on Friday 15 November 2024. This will also be intended to help raise money for Children in Need.

This is the first non school uniform day the school has had for a few years and we are keen to make sure that the students understand the expectations for the day in advance so the day is a success. Please read the information below carefully-

- Students can pay a voluntary £1 donation at the school gate upon arrival. All donations will go to Children in Need.
- This is a normal school day. Students will be expected to uphold our high expectations for behaviour and conduct in lessons and around the school site.
- Mobile phones must remain in bags and not seen and not heard.
- Students will be required to bring all equipment required for lessons, this includes PE kit if there is a timetabled lesson. We advise that students continue to bring school bags.
- Please ensure that students dress appropriately for a day at school and for the time of year. This means that students should not wear crop tops and shorts and skirts should be appropriate length. Similarly, tops and shirts should be appropriate for a school setting. This means there should be no inappropriate slogans or motifs that would be considered offensive or not age appropriate.



- Facial piercings are also not allowed and students will be asked to remove these. Students are welcome to continue to wear school uniforms if they feel more comfortable to do so.
- If the school has any concerns about a child's appearance, we will make contact with home and take appropriate steps to resolve the matter before the student attends lessons.

We hope that all families will follow these guidelines so that we have a positive day and students are celebrated for the positive start to the school year.
