End of Summer Term 2024

In January, I presented assemblies to each year group, with the theme, "Let's make 2024 a year to be proud of...".

2023 was a truly triumphant year for us, as we broke all school records for progress and attainment, were among the top performing schools in Somerset, in the top 10% nationally for improvement and well above the national average in all areas. Building on that success would be a challenge, but thanks to the amazing hard work of the staff and students, Ofsted finally came and wrote a report glowing with praise for the academy.

I particularly liked the comments made by Ofsted about our students (who I believe are 'Simply the Best'), which included:
