Curiosity Corner			

Our curious quest for this term has been "Did dragons exist?" The children have visited many marvellous stories such as Zog, The knight who wouldn't fight and Dragon Stew. Reading these adventures has led us to talk about castles and the characteristics of what would make a safe castle.

During Science Week, the children explored "What a Scientist is" and what clothing they may wear to make their experiments safe. The children talked extensively about animals that can camouflage. Some of the chameleons had camouflaged themselves in the outdoor environment for us to find, which was great fun. Our curious learners discussed migration, we looked closely at what animals migrate and we built on our previous focus with some more animal knowledge.

At the beginning of the term we took great enjoyment from making pancakes just like 'Mr Wolf's Pancakes.' The children had the opportunity to flip pancakes independently. They demonstrated incredible positivity to every friend that gave it a go, by cheering and offering encouragement. The children have ended the term following a biscuit recipe. They measured, mixed and rolled their mixture to make delicious Easter bunny's. Next term, we will be exploring 'How can we protect our planet?'



## Reception

Our topic this term has led us around the world investigating animals and their habitats. This inspired some fantastic non-fiction writing that captured the learning from our science lessons.

During Science Week we focused on the various ways that animals camouflage. We investigated animals that use disruptive colouration, disguise and mimicry. We then used the green screen to work as a team to identify the animal camouflaged in the background. We designed moths and used collage to create a moth that we then conducted an experiment to camouflage them in our outdoor area.

We have now learnt all of set 1 and 2 sounds and are revisiting many of our digraphs and trigraphs. We are embedding this learning by using these phonemes in words and sentences. It has been impressive to see the children applying this with growing independence.



Dragonfly Class have had a busy Term 4, filled with lots of exciting new learning opportunities. We dipped our toes into the world of science during Science Week by exploring the fascinating states of matter. The children got to put on their scientist hats, using microscopes and conducting lots of fun experiments! It was a joy to see their curiosity and enthusiasm shine through as they learned about the wonderful world of science.

One of the highlights this term was visiting the local care home. Our class had the opportunity to interview the residents about their childhoods. The children generated questions linked to their history topic and interviewed the residents using these. It was amazing to see the connections formed as our young ones listened to stories from the past, building bridges between generations.

On Vocabulary Day, Dragonfly Class also transformed into budding inventors! Each child came up with their very own futuristic invention. They also stepped into the shoes of a news reporter and presented their creative inventions to the whole class. The children certainly came up with some incredible ideas!

In maths, we have enjoyed investigating different measurements - especially capacity! We have participated in lots of activities allowing us to measure lots of different things around our classroom.

Over the term, the children have worked extremely hard and enjoyed learning about lots of new topics. Thank you for your continued support at home, we hope you have a lovely and restful break.

We participated in the annual 'Dance Umbrella' with some of our Reception and Year 1 children who performed beautifully at The Bath Forum. They worked very hard and their performance was a testament to all their efforts – well done to our talented young dancers! ## Year 2

Year 2 have really enjoyed a busy Term 4 and we definitely have a few highlights that have made us all smile! We kicked off this term with our exciting Vocabulary Day! The children loved dressing up as their favourite words and sharing them with the class. The creativity was off the charts, and it was so much fun seeing the children not only enjoying words but also learning new ones to add to their growing vocabularies.

Our Girls' Football Day was a huge hit! It was wonderful to see so many of our girls getting active and having a go at football. They dribbled, they kicked, and they scored! The teamwork and enthusiasm were fantastic, and we're hopeful this will inspire some future football stars! We then rolled into Science week, which left us all buzzing with excitement. We explored the wonders of the world through fun experiments and activities. The children became mini scientists, investigating and researching 'Pitcher Plants'. Curiosity and a love for exploring definitely shone through!

We have also really enjoyed our Geography topic this term, 'Why is our world wonderful?'. The children have been discovering some of the UK's and World's marvellous human and physical features and not to mention our very own Midsomer Norton! The children have loved being Geographers Investigating new and old maps of Midsomer Norton and then drawing their own mini sketch maps.

You may have also noticed that we are nurturing little green thumbs, with our exploration of plants, seeds and bulbs in Science. The children have planted their own seeds and created their very own seed diaries. We have then compared the growth of these seeds with other variables, such as the plant growing in the dark, which has allowed us to observe something very interesting! This experience has deepened our knowledge of the plant life cycle and what they need to grow. It's been a thrill to watch their faces light up as their plants grow a little each day!

Maths has been an exciting journey as we explore fractions, focusing on halves, quarters and thirds. We are working on recognising and creating simple fractions, both with numerals and shapes.

We are incredibly proud of all the hard work and enthusiasm shown by the children this term. Our classrooms are a place of discovery where every day brings new opportunities for learning and growing and we thank you for your continued support in your child's learning journey.









#### **Vocab Day**

A big thank you to everyone who helped make Vocabulary Day 2025 a huge success. It was wonderful to see the children's creativity shine through as they dressed up as different words and participated in a lively vocabulary parade. The whole-school dictionary we put together was a delightful collection of entries, and the children had great fun guessing each other's word choices. Around this event, the whole school also did some incredible work inspired by the book 'What We'll Build'.



Term 4 has been filled with exciting learning experiences for Year 3! In Maths, students have been exploring fractions and practising measuring mass, developing their skills in these key areas through hands-on activities. In Literacy, the children have been busy crafting imaginative stories about the "Silent Seeker," using their creativity to build engaging plots and characters. The History curriculum has taken us back to Roman times, where students have learned about the mighty Roman Army. They had the chance to try out army formation training, using the Roman shields they created as part of their home learning to understand the tactics that made them such effective soldiers.

During Science Week, we were lucky enough to take part in multiple engaging workshops, including one hosted by Wessex Water, where students explored the importance of water conservation and the science behind it. The hands-on activities sparked curiosity and deepened their understanding of environmental science.

Year 3 had a fantastic opportunity to take part in a Zoom workshop with Stephen Pass, author of *Madge the Mermaid*. The session was inspiring and interactive, as students learned about the creative writing process and the journey of bringing a story to life. One of the highlights was exploring shorthand writing! The children enjoyed practising this unique skill and discovering how it can be used for quick note-taking and secret messages. It was an engaging experience that sparked creativity and a love for storytelling!

What a busy term it's been in Leopard class! The children took great interest in their Science Week topic of forces, learning all about what makes the world go round, and rose to the challenge of designing their own 'maximum air resistance outfit' with such enthusiasm as we tested our findings at the end of the week! Combined with our termly Science topic teaching all about the workings of sound and vibrations, they have learnt how to put together hypotheses on the topics they have studied.

Meanwhile, last term's Maths topic of fractions has lent itself well to moving on to decimals this term, our English has taught us all about the lives of others from across the world as we studied refugees in "Wisp: A Story of Hope" and Polynesia in "Ariki and the Island of Wonders", French has seen the children learning how to tell the weather, and RE has tied us perfectly into the Easter break by studying exactly who Jesus was and why he is so important to the lives of Christians. Aside from this, we have learnt to greatly appreciate our chocolate by studying where food is sourced from in Geography and connected this to learning how to live healthier lives in PSHE, while we have been practising our programming and digital problem-solving skills in both Computer Science and when learning how to create a timer that fits a design brief in DT!

Not to mention all the wonderful additional activities that we have been lucky to witness this term - the truly inspiring outfits made Vocabulary Day shine, Girls' Football Day was a huge hit, and it has been so heartwarming to see how the whole class has been inspired by World Poetry Day! Not only have the children had the opportunity to write haiku poetry to perform to in Music, but our author workshop with Year 3 and performed pieces across the term have left many of the children demanding to hear more poems throughout the school day! The adults have been very proud of the Leopards' enthusiasm for everything this term has brought their way and hope you all have a well-earned relaxing Easter break.
