I can't believe it's the end of Term 5 already. I know I say it every term, but this one has really flown!

We have been learning how to tell the time over the last 2 weeks. It's a very challenging concept but the children have shown lots of resilience and determination. What an amazing Term 5 in Foxes Class!

We have been busy with lots of learning over the last two week's of term.

During English, we have retold the first chapter man in first person. The children impressed me with their use of interesting words and application of subordinating conjunctions. We have also been learning our favourite poem off by heart ready to perform to the rest of the school on **Poetry Day**.

In Maths, we are feeling confident with adding and subtracting fractions. We have learnt that 1000g = 1kg and using this knowledge to solve Maths problems.

We have been learning about the different ways that plants distribute their seeds. We were amazed to discover there were so many ways and intrigued to discover that a coconut is one seed which floats on the sea to a different location to germinate in a new location. We also planted some marigold seeds and can't wait to see if they have

started to grow over the half term break.

In Geography, we have learnt about megacities in Europe and located them on a map. We have been learning about trade and were fascinated to discover that we import a lot of our fruit and vegetables from Spain. The children are beginning to understand import and export in the context of trade within Europe.

During Art, we have used Georgia O'Keefe as our inspiration for sketching a section of a flower and enlarging it to create a beautiful piece of abstract art.

This week, we were joined by our parents in PE where we were able to show our learning of ball control. We showed our family members how we have learned to catch the ball and throw it in different ways. We were delighted when they joined in with our learning, such a great afternoon.

Where has that term gone? The time really is flying by and as usual, the Lions are working incredibly hard and putting maximum effort into their learning.

In PE, we have been enjoying our weekly swimming lessons and the children are continuing to show incredible water confidence and are developing their swimming skills. Some of this is quite tricky, including the butterfly stroke and being able to tread water, but the Lions have been fantastic and the progress is clear to see.

In Maths, we have been working on perimeter and we have had to be really accurate with our addition and using our times tables to help us with the calculations. We also enjoyed having parents and family members join us for a workshop where we looked at times tables and played different games that required us to use our times tables facts.

I have been incredibly impressed by the Lion's recent piece of writing which has been based on the book 'Who Let the Gods Out'. We have been writing a balanced argument and the children have had to think really hard about how to present each side of the argument and the particular features needed in a piece of writing to ensure it is balanced, before they could give their own opinion at the end.

Finally, in Art, we have created our final paintings using various paint techniques to create objects that look 3D. We had to carefully create a composition and then bring in tint and tone to show the light and shadow in each object.

Well done for another fabulous term Lions - have a well deserved rest over half term!

The SATs breakfasts each morning were certainly a hit and we had a lovely time at our celebration picnic on the field on Friday afternoon.

Our work in Music this term has been on the theme of *Film Music*. We have enjoyed watching Wallace and Gromit: A Close Shave, listening to the orchestral music in the background and identifying how the playing of the instruments is being matched to the storyline.

We then enjoyed composing and notating our own musical scores which we played along with the film with the sound turned down. Our compositions had to relate to different scenes with different emotions, such as danger, sadness or love.

In Art we have begun our unit of photography and composition.

Over the past two weeks, Eagles have been exploring different ways of experimenting with photography. They have developed their photography skills by taking their own macro photos of pieces of fruit, experimenting with the different backdrops and editing options. We then moved on to assessing different composition choices by looking at the artist Hannah Hoch to create our own photomontages.


