We have always prided ourselves on our Open Door policy and as parents ourselves, we would both want to address this in person with our own children's schools if we felt they were not safe for over 6 hours a day.

It would also be appreciated if more parents and carers could complete the survey as we are only at about half of the amount of responses we usually receive.

We will send out all the results and findings early in September.

Breakfast Club

Having listened to the views of many parents and carers, Breakfast Club will be starting at the earlier time of 7:30am from September to cater for those parents who need to start their working day earlier. Please book/pay for your place via ParentPay. Initially the charge will remain the same as we trial this new initiative.

Attendance Matters

We pride ourselves on high attendance at Farrington. We consistently rank within the top couple of schools in the Midsomer Norton Schools Partnership in terms of children's attendance. As of last week we were over 96% attendance.

This is also mirrored and modelled by our staff, for instance since September, we have only lost 3 teaching days to sickness, meaning an attendance rate of over 99.5%

Summer Wellness Day to Longleat

One of the most popular parts of our school offer has been the termly wellness days and weeks. Our Term 6 Wellness Day is our trip to Longleat on Tuesday.

One of the joys of being in such a small and friendly school is the ability for us all to uproot en masse and spend this valuable time together to celebrate the end of another successful year. We are one of the very few schools in the area to embark on a trip like this and also to put on as many opportunities as we do - on top of many sporting and music events, this year alone we have taken children to Stonehenge, Wookey Hole, Downside, the Roman Baths, the East Somerset Railway at Cranmore, Bristol Aquarium, Bath Abbey, Wells Cathedral and Lifeskills as well as residentials at the Mendip Outdoor Centre, PGL on the Isle of Wight and of course to Athens! School trips really help to build the cultural capital of our children and are a very valuable part of what we believe our school should provide.

PENALTY NOTICE FINES FOR SCHOOL ATTENDANCE IS CHANGING



The first time a Penalty Notice is issued for Ferm Time Leave or irregular Attendance the amount will be:

er parent, per child if paid within 28 days ed to £80 per parent, per child if paid 21 days.



The second time a Penalty Notice is issued for Term Time Leave or Irregular Attendance the amount will be:

£160 per parent, per child to be paid within 28 days. No reduced rate will be offered.

The following changes will come into force for **Penalty Notice Fines** issued after 19th August 2024.

THIRD OFFENCE AND ANY FURTHER OFFENCES (WITHIN 3 YEARS)

The third time an offence is committed for Term Time Leave or Irregular Attendance a Penalty Notice will not be issued, and the case will be presented straight to the Magistrates' Court. Magistrates' fines can be up to £2500 per parent, per child.

Cases found guilty in Magistrates' Court can show on a Parents future DBS certificate, due to failure to safeguard a child's education'.

10 SESSIONS (5 DAYS) OF UNAUTHOURISED ABSENCE IN A 10-WEEK PERIOD

Penalty Notice Fines will be considered when there has been 10 sessions of unauthourised absence in a 10-week period

Thought of the Week

'And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age.' (Matthew 28:20)

I don't know about you, but sometimes things happen that I just don't understand. There doesn't seem to be any explanation and nothing anyone says helps to make sense of the situation.

We might not like some of the things we go through, but we can often look back on those experiences and in hindsight, we can see that we have gained some value from them. Maybe we're wiser because of what's happened to us. Maybe we are more understanding towards others who are going through similar situations. Painful experiences can make us stronger and can help us to be more empathetic to others.

Unfortunately, there are some experiences and situations that we just can't explain away. Maybe you're going through a painful time right now and you just can't make sense of it.

Well, if so, you're not alone. And the last thing you need is for someone to tell you what they think and to try and give you some of their own insights and thoughts even if they are trying to be helpful.

Often when we are going through these times, we just need to know that there is someone who has got our back - someone who is thinking about us and is there if we need them.

For many of us, this will be a friend or family member. Someone we can message if we need to, someone who is ready to talk to us if we need them to. Often, just knowing that they are there can be enough. One guy called Job had three friends who just sat with him for seven days before he started opening up. For those of us who know the story, we might

argue that this was when they were most helpful!

For many Christians, whatever they are going through, it is often enough knowing that Jesus is with them. They may not have an answer from God, they may still be deeply confused and even angry about what's going on, but just knowing and sensing Jesus' presence can make all the difference. No answers but a sense of peace anyway.

I hope that if you are going through a difficult time right now that you have someone who is willing and able to go through it with you. You can even reach out to God in these moments. Maybe you have lots of questions and doubts, maybe you're not even sure that God is there. Well, maybe now is the time to find out. Even if you don't find answers, hopefully you will find a sense of hope, peace and love.
