

### **Speaking Guidance**

- The chosen poem (from a choice of 2) must be learnt off by heart.
- Stand still with relaxed hands in other words don't fidget!
- Always good to settle down by giving a clear intro of title and poet straight to the adjudicator and take a tiny pause before starting the poem.
- Don't rush delivery.
- Catch the mood of the poem; demonstrate an understanding of its themes through the use of voice and facial expressions.
- No acting or extreme actions are allowed because the idea is that the voice communicates effectively by the use of a variety of tone, pitch and pace together with accompanying emotions being visual facially.
- Small gestures such as a shrug if relevant- tend to be acceptable.
- Make the last line count.
- Enjoy the rapturous applause.

Welcome back and Happy New Year everyone. Badgers have had a super start to the year over the past two weeks, demonstrating a fresh enthusiasm for learning.

In English, we have been reading 'Meerkat Mail', the children have enjoyed writing all about what Meerkats eat this week. They are looking forward to planning and writing their non-chronological report all about Meerkats over the next few weeks. We are concentrating on key skills in our writing, such as using present tense, lists and expanded noun phrases.

In Maths, we have been exploring 2D shapes and their properties. Badgers have enjoyed working practically with different shapes, counting their vertices and sides to identify the shape name.

In Science, we have begun looking at our new topics Everyday Materials and Badgers have enjoyed investigating the different properties of materials found in their everyday lives and the purposes these materials may be useful for.



In Art, we started our new topic on sculpture by looking at the difference between 2D and 3D. The children looked at the work of Kenyan artist Magdalene Odundo for inspiration. Using chalk, the children drew detailed sketches of sculptures highlighting light and dark areas to make a 2D object look 3D.

In Computing, we have started to think about how to collect data to answer questions we might want to know the answer to. The children experimented with collecting data and looked at how accurate they were and how they could improve their data collection techniques.

Finally, in Geography, we have begun to look at the USA and used atlases to locate the country and find out some of its key physical features. The children already knew quite a lot about America and are looking forward to learning more about this fascinating country.

We have a busy term lined up for the Foxes and we can't wait to get stuck into Term 3!

#### **Class News:**

Our Year 5 Lions have started the year in fine style, returning to school with their usual commitment and enthusiasm and demonstrating that they are ready to meet all the exciting experiences 2025 has to offer them head on!

We have begun some new interesting topics this term. In Geography, all of our work will be based around *Global Trade*. This week, we have been looking at where all of our 'stuff' comes from, researching where things arrive in the UK from and finding these places in atlases. We soon realised how much is imported from China!

Our work in English is inspired by the book 'A Galaxy Of Her Own: Amazing Stories of Women in Space' by Libby Jackson. We have been planning biographies of our own amazing women whom we have invented, deciding what their great space achievements might have been. Term 3 has a real Space focus with a lot of connections to the Earth and beyond through our work in Science and also

in Art, where we have been studying propaganda posters linked to the *Space Race* and examples of retrofuturism artwork.

We had a really fun time in Latin where we played a game of real-life human Guess Who? In our unit on Adjectives and Agreement, we have been describing ourselves (eye colour, hair colour etc) and we created game cards so that we could play our own version of the classic board game. For example, you might have had to sit down if 'capillos brunos habes'! (Translation: You have brown hair.)

Finally, we enjoyed performing to a large audience at a music event this week. We have been working hard at developing our singing skills with Mrs Munro.

### Class News:

2025 has got off to a flying start in Year 6 Eagles. We have returned to school full of enthusiasm and determination to do our best!

The children have made a great first impression on Miss Woods and are really living our school vision of 'I can do all things!'.

This term, we are continuing with our class novel 'Pig Heart Boy'. We are going to be writing a balanced argument over the next few weeks debating whether animals organs should be used in human transplants. We are focusing on making our writing as formal as possible by using passive voice and appropriate fronted adverbials.

In Maths, we have started our new unit on *decimals*. A secure understanding of place value is key when working with decimals and we have been revisiting some of our learning from earlier in the year. Miss Woods has been particularly impressed with Eagles determination with improving their arithmetic scores and we can see even more progress already!

Finally, we have had our first trip of 2025, a visit to the **Lifeskills Centre** in Bristol!

Timsbury Parish Council have generously provided us with the funds to enable us to offer this important trip to all Year 6 children for free! We are incredibly grateful for their kind donation; the children had a thoroughly enjoyable day. They learnt a range of skills to help them in their daily lives, including road and fire safety, making a 999 call and staying safe around railways, to name a few of the incredible real-life scenarios they found themselves in.




### Courage


