What you said...	...what we are doing
SEN provision could be improved	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• We have recruited a Head of School who is an experienced SENDCo</li> <li>• We acknowledged the increased number of children needing SEN support and have increased the amount of Speech and Language support.</li> <li>• We have employed 2 additional teaching assistants who have a large SEN commitment.</li> <li>• We have made an increased number of referrals to our school nurse for mental health support.</li> <li>• We have therapy sessions planned for the year ahead.</li> </ul>
Concerns around behaviour	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• We have acknowledged that we have some cohorts containing children with additional needs and this can be challenging for all.</li> <li>• Staff report that the general behaviour in school has vastly improved since the new behaviour policy started in September</li> <li>• Parents have been more informed if their children are not behaving well - signalling additional support for some children.</li> <li>• Additional support staff has meant that lessons are rarely disrupted.</li> </ul>
Staffing	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• There were some concerns around staff turnover..</li> <li>• We have shown that recent staff recruitment has been very successful with a number of excellent appointments being made.</li> </ul>
Other things of note	
<p><b>Collective Worship:</b> There were a number of people unsure about the impact of Collective Worship in enabling children to flourish. It is worth noting that Celebration Assembly is an act of collective worship, and clearly demonstrates us celebrating the children flourishing in and out of school. We may not have made it clear that these Friday gatherings count as collective worship. Our SIAMs report from February 2024 noted that our actions resulted in a 'flourishing for all'.</p> <p><b>Recommend the School:</b> The percentage of parents who would recommend the school went up from 89% last year to 95% this year, which is pleasing.</p> <p><b>Anonymous Comments:</b> We make our survey anonymous to try to extract information in a way in which people can be honest in their replies. There were many comments made which we have taken note of, although as we expressed in a newsletter last year, we believe that if parents/carers have strong feelings about the school (for example in terms of their child's safety or wellbeing), they should be making an appointment to see us so we can understand what the specific issues are and try our best to resolve them, rather than leaving them as an anonymous comment which cannot therefore be addressed as effectively. Our policy has always been to try and deal with issues as they arise so please do contact any of the school team whenever you have something you would like to bring to our attention.</p>
