Penalty notice fines for school attendance are changing

The following statutory changes from the DfE will come into force for penalty notice fines issued after 19 August 2024. All fines are held by the Local Authority

1. First offence

The first time a penalty notice is issued for ferm time leave or irregular attendance, the amount will be:

\$160 per parent, per child if paid within 28 days. Reduced to \$50 per parent. per child if paid within 21 days.

2. Second offence

(within 3 years)

The second time a penalty notice is issued for term time leave or irregular attendance, the amount will be:

£160 per parent, per child to be paid within 26 days. No reduced rate will be offered.

3. Third offence and any further offences

(within 3 years)

The third time an offence is committed for term time leave or irregular attendance, a penalty notice will not be issued and the case will be presented straight to the Magistrates' Court; fines can be up to £2500 per parent, per child. Cases found guilty in Magistrates' Court can show on a parent's future DES certificate, due to failure to safeguard a child's education.

10 sessions (5 days) of unauthorised absence in a 10-week period

Penalty notice fines will be considered when there has been 10 sessions of unauthorised absence in a 10 week period.
