Here, at Clutton we consistently provide our children with as many varied activities and opportunities as we can to give them as broad a range of experiences as possible. These include musical events, sports festivals, forest school, local trips, residentials and so much more. However, it is important to remember that we are also here to ensure that children achieve the very best they can academically to provide them with the best possible chance of success as they progress to secondary school and into their working lives. Therefore we were really pleased to read about how well our school had done in the Bath and North East Somerset Key Stage 2 performance tables just before the Christmas break. Nearly 90% of our pupils reached age-related expectations in reading and maths (compared with 74% and 73% nationally) while 82% of our children reached this in writing (compared with 72% nationally). A fantastic achievement and a reflection of all the hard work put in by pupils and staff.

Yesterday was National Handwriting Day. Children have been really thinking about this in their writing sessions this week and having extra practice as their early morning activity. In order to celebrate, children from each class showed their wonderful handwriting skills in assembly.
