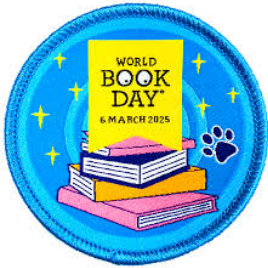

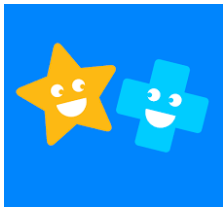


Head Teacher Awards
