Transitions- how I can help my child:

Transitions whether they are between Year Groups, Key Stages or Schools can be a stressful time for children as they get used to new routines, new adults, new friends and new surroundings. This is the case for all children and for children with special educational needs the changes can be even more unsettling. As a parent or carer you can help!

- ★ Starting conversations with your child and finding out how they feel about the transition is a great start.
- Asking them what they are looking forward to, what they will miss about their old school and class.
- ★ Thinking about what they enjoy doing and what they find difficult.

These are all ways of helping your child get ready and make the best possible transition. 




FREE family cycle training

This Summer B&NES Council is pleased to offer free family cycle training in Midsomer Norton at Free Rangers Forest School Nursery.

This one to one course is designed to instruct the lead family member how to shepherd the group with road safety tactics.
