Reading in Year Five


In Year Five this term, Rowan and Pine classes have been reading around our Geography topic: Mountains.

To inspire our own diary entries, we have learned about how Edmund Hillary and Tenzing Norgay summited Mount Everest in 1953, almost exactly 71 years ago. To do this, we followed their route from Base Camp to the summit, read an extract from Hillary's own diary (written at over 8000 metres above sea level) and even wrote postcards to send back down!

Both classes have impressed us with their superb recounts that showed us how much they had learned about the remarkable ascent to the world's highest (not tallest!) peak.
