### What a busy term!

Finally the sun has made some appearances and it has been wonderful to see the children able to enjoy our tremendous outdoor spaces to their full advantage, including pond dipping for tadpoles in The Orchard, caterpillars metamorphosing into butterflies, chicks hatching from eggs, visiting ducks, cultivating plants - what an uplifting term it has been!

Responding to feedback to children in a recent Governor Learning Walk, we are currently researching options with the intention of replacing the now tired-looking outdoor play equipment over the summer holidays, in addition to getting the playground markings replaced. #### Attendance

We are receiving an increasing number of requests for holidays or days off during term time. Please be aware of the impact that this can have on your child's progress. Lessons are carefully planned as part of a sequence that builds daily on prior learning. As a result, gaps in learning, once they have occurred, can be difficult to effectively address. I ask that we work together to maximise your child's potential by avoiding term-time absences.

### PSHE

In Term 6 we will be teaching the 'Changing Me' Puzzle in our PSHE lessons across the school. This helps children learn to cope positively with all sorts of change. In Key Stage 2 they will learn about puberty. In Key Stage 1 we introduce scientific terminology for body parts, including genitalia, partly for safeguarding reasons and partly to lay the foundations for learning about puberty later. The government statutory guidance gives parents the right to request to withdraw their child from Sex Education.
