#### Message from the Headteacher

Yesterday I had the pleasure of accompanying the Year Six children to Bristol. We had a self guided tour of the M Shed, where we learnt about Bristol life through the ages, and then we took a boat trip up the river on a guided tour of the landmarks and people linked to the transatlantic slave trade. The children (and adults) all returned with fascinating facts and are eager to continue their History learning in class.

This week all of the teaching and support staff at St John's have had training from the Specialist Autism Support Service team, developing our understanding on how to further support children across the school. Some of the top tips will be shared in the SEND section of purple pages next week.

Next week will be assessment week across the school. The children will be taking baseline assessments in Maths and Reading to show their understanding at this point in the year. The assessments will take place in a supportive environment, with some year groups doing a few questions a day, children being taken out in small groups and teachers referring to them as quizzes.

#### SEND

If your child is on the Special Educational Needs (SEND) Register, your child's class teacher will be making, or may have already made, contact with you to discuss their Individual Support Plan (ISP). The ISP is an important document which celebrates your child's successes and highlights what they find challenging in school. It will also outline the targets they are currently working on and how we are supporting them with this.

In order for this document to be effective, it is vital that input from parents/carers is included. You know your child better than anyone so your information is key to ensure any support given in school is successful.


If your child is on the SEND register, and you have not heard from their teacher by Friday 27th September, please contact them to arrange a discussion.

#### Maths



At the start of the new academic year, all classes have been focusing on place value using concrete, pictorial and abstract approaches to deepen understanding. Alongside daily practice, students engage in 15 minutes of arithmetic each day, building on the skills learned in class to ensure key concepts are well embedded.

Regular interventions are also in place to provide additional support for children needing further consolidation. Additionally, times table practice is being conducted across the school to promote fluency and instant recall, ensuring all students develop strong foundational mathematics skills.



#### Year Six History Trip

Yesterday, our wonderful Year Six students travelled to Bristol to learn more about the city's development during the Georgian Era, in particular, its connection to the Transatlantic Slave Trade.

We went on a voyage along the harbour (conveniently, it was International 'Talk Like a Pirate' Day) where we learned about the experiences of a young Bristolian sailor working on a slave ship. We were also introduced to some key figures from the Abolitionist Movement, including William Wilberforce.











At the M Shed, the children were given the opportunity to act as information detectives, using the clues in their booklet to locate information and answer questions about Georgian Bristol. The children also saw the Colston statue lying horizontally in the museum, having been toppled at the Harbourside in 2020. This sparked some very mature discussions amongst our students about the legacy of the Slave Trade.

Overall, it was a fantastic day and we are very proud of our Year Six's for their engagement, curiosity and enthusiasm.







#### Helping our Community

Last year, the Rota Kids organised their own fundraising event to raise money for the local Silver Street Nature Reserve. With all your generosity and support, we were able to raise  $\pounds155$  and are proud to share that the money raised was used to install a new bench next to the spring head.

We are lucky enough to be able to feature in the Journal this week so keep your eyes peeled for the children's amazing achievements. Well done Rota Kids!






#### **Reading in Year Four**


