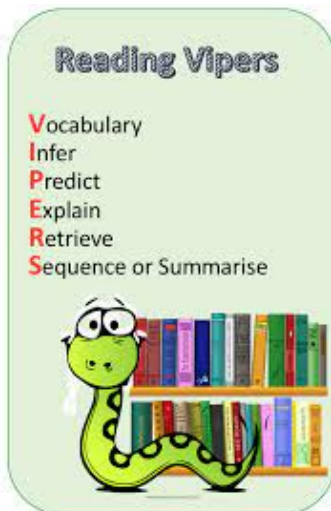
Dear Parents/Carers,

Happy New Year to you all! We hope you had a wonderful, restful Christmas with your families. We would like to start by thanking you all for the very generous and thoughtful Christmas cards and gifts that your children brought in at the end of last term.

Here we are again, another term together. We have been so impressed with the Foxes' hard work over Terms 1 and 2 and cannot wait to see what this term brings!

Reading

One of our main methods of teaching reading in Fox Class is through our weekly whole class reading comprehension lessons and book studies, which the children are really enjoying. Aptly named, this term our whole class reading book will be *Fantastic Mr Fox* (Roald Dahl), which we will discuss and explore using a 'VIPERS' approach:






The children will still have the opportunity to read regularly to adults on a 1:1 and small group basis, and should bring their book bags into school every day. Reading books will continue to be sent home and changed each week. If you read their books quickly, then we encourage you to re-read the books. As Well as supporting fluency, pace and prosody. Re-reading connects the meaning to the words and illustrations to gain a deeper understanding of characters, themes and story concepts. The children will soon also begin weekly quizzes online (Accelerated Reader) based on their weekly reading books, to support us in monitoring the children's comprehension and progress

Please continue to support us by reading with your child at home as much as possible (at least 3 times a week) with a small note in their Reading Record.

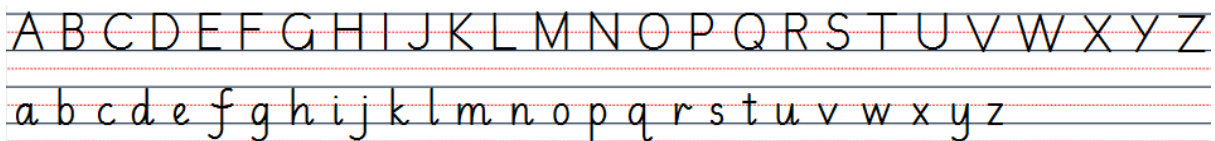

The unit we will be exploring in these lessons this term is narrative in style; *The Owl who was Afraid of the Dark* by Jill Tomlinson. The children will also have writing opportunities in their foundation subjects, this will include writing a letter and diary entry in the role of Florence Nightingale.

Transcription

The children continue working hard on their handwriting and we know you are already seeing improvements - please do continue to support their transcription at home.



Spelling

The children will continue to study a different spelling pattern or rule each week. The children will be given the overview of spellings to keep in their homework books so you can see what spelling rules are coming up next, as well as a reminder of what has come before. Please support the children with learning these spellings/rules and spotting them in their reading and writing. Homework books need to be handed in each **Thursday** and we will have an informal test each Friday, before the new rule is introduced.

Maths

We have a busy term ahead in maths, focussing on Money as well as Multiplication and Division. We are sure the children will continue to flourish within these practical topics. These skills and concepts will build on their prior learning and give them further opportunities to develop and apply their knowledge. Foxes will also continue to consolidate their number fact fluency through daily sessions of Fluency Bees.

Just a quick reminder: please continue to work on DoodleMaths, [DoodleTables](#) and [Hit the Button](#). It is exciting to see the ever-growing confidence and love of mathematical learning in Fox Class. This term the children will have individual Doodle Maths bookmarks to keep in class: to record and celebrate when they are in the 'Green Zone' each Monday. Our class' goal is to earn the DoodleMaths trophy at least once this term; individually, when enough green zone stickers have been earned, your child will also receive a reward. If you do have any questions, please use the parent support area on Doodle Maths.

Wider Curriculum

As *Historians* this term, the children will be learning all about Florence Nightingale as a significant individual.

As *Scientists*, the children will learn about and explore the Uses of Everyday materials.

In *Art*, the children will be using a range of materials and techniques to produce work based on well known artists whilst applying prior learning. Projects will include a map of their journey to school, using felt, to produce an abstract piece of art and printmaking.

In *RE*, we will be thinking about Salvation in Christianity and begin to look at Easter.

Computing will focus on creating Music using Chrome Music Lab - you can access this for free at home at <https://musiclab.chromeexperiments.com/>

In *PSHE* we will be discussing Dreams and Goals - what these could be and how they can be achieved.

PE this term will be Mondays (**Fundamentals with Mr Tom**) and Wednesdays (**Team Games with Mrs MacDonald**). Please ensure your child wears warm, long legged clothes, as PE will take place outside in the playground, weather permitting.

Reminders

- Please remember to send your child with a named piece of **fruit** for their morning snack; we continue to have school provided fruit for KS1 children, in the afternoons.
- All children need to wear their **PE kits** to school on the days they have PE.
- Please ensure that **all property** in school is labelled with your child's name, particularly: jumpers, PE kits, water bottles, wellies and fruit pots.
