

Reading in Year Three

In Guided Reading this week, the children have been actively engaging with "Charlotte's Web," by E.B. White. They have been reading the story in small, focused groups as well as whole class sessions, where they practice fluency and comprehension skills. As they progress through the chapters, the students have been discussing key themes such as friendship, loyalty, and the circle of life. They've also been identifying character traits of Wilbur, Charlotte, and other animals in the story, and reflecting on their motivations and

actions. Through targeted questions and discussions, the children are building a deeper understanding of the plot while improving their critical thinking and vocabulary.









Author Book Donation


Local Bath Author Dinah Darby has very kindly gifted the school 60 copies of her children's book 'Asking Grandad' for our Year Six children.

It's Competition Time!


