We are thrilled to see our school attendance continue to shine this academic year! Somervale School currently boasts the second-best attendance in our trust and ranks as the top school for boys' attendance across the trust. Our overall attendance rate stands at an impressive 94.1%, which is over 3% higher than the national average.

We are especially proud to celebrate the 385 students who achieved an attendance rate of over 97% this term—an incredible accomplishment! Additionally, 156 students have shown remarkable progress by improving their attendance from Term 2 to Term 3.

At Somervale, promoting consistent attendance is a core part of our school culture. We emphasise to students how regular attendance supports their education, overall well-being, and personal development. Being in school allows children to build meaningful friendships, enjoy social interactions, and engage in enriching learning experiences—all of which are crucial for their mental and emotional health, as well as their academic success.


Science Department

Well done to everyone for taking part, and thank you to Matt for such a great day!








Midsomer Norton Schools Partnership Library Book Awards








Boy's Football

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

We wish to thank the band for raising awareness of SEN needs with first-hand examples, as well as reiterating online safety to the impressionable audience.








