Dear Parents/Carers

I cannot believe that it is finally the end of what seems like two incredibly long terms. As always it has been a very busy term. 
Bath University - A level Trip

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


This term students in KS3 were asked to complete a reading survey. We wanted to know about whether they read for pleasure, whether they enjoy our library lessons, and about their reading habits.






Christmas Book Fair





This will be happening at the end of January and all members of the Ammerdown council are extremely excited to raise some money for Happy Landings.


