In Maths, we have been investigating more challenging repeating patterns, following ABAB and ABC patterns using a variety of coloured toys and a very colourful caterpillar!



In PSED we have shared the story of 'the Colour Monster', a lovely tale about a monster who needs help to un-jumble his emotions. The children have been very thoughtful and discussed what different feelings seem like to them and what they might make us do.

We have enjoyed reflecting on specific experiences which made us feel a certain way.

A few of the children mentioned Forest School this week as an activity which made them feel happy.

Others said that they were calm, and noted one of their friends who had fallen asleep as she must have been feeling very calm!
