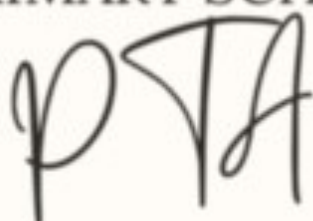
We require donations of teddies for the teddy stall to go head—please drop these to the school office.
